Job Announcement

The Pit River Tribe is a Tribe comprised of eleven (11) autonomous bands that since time immemorial have resided in the area known as the 100-mile square, located in parts of Shasta, Siskiyou, Modoc, and Lassen Counties in the State of California.

Position Job Description:	Sawyer-Seasonal On-call
Department:	EPO Office of Environmental Programs
Reports To:	EPO Director
Status:	Seasonal and project funds dependent
Annual Salary Range:	\$15.00 to \$17.00

Purpose:

The Pit River Tribe (PRT) job description is a management tool to help organize duties and provide employees with the employer's expectations with regard to the specific job classification. The duties listed are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work that may be performed. The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is a reasonable assignment for the position.

Summary: The Sawyer must be trained and certified in the proper use of a chainsaw, have the experience and capability to work in rough terrain

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Cut away dead, obstructive, or excess branches from trees and shrubbery as directed by EPO Crew Leader
- Utilize chain saws and work crews to safely cut down limbs.
- Remove debris and cart away large limbs for disposal.
- Cable, brace, tie, bolt, stake, and guy trees and branches to provide support.
- Use shovels and Mcleods to clear debris.

Key Skills and Knowledge:

- Ability to set up and operate chainsaws to cut bushes, branches, trees to specified dimensions
- Ability to safely install chains on saw and set guide bars and stops.
- Examines saw equipment for defects, such as chipped edges and marred surfaces to prevent injury
- May mark cutting lines on trees and bushes.
- Capability to sharpen chain, using round and flat files.
- Documented certification in saw uses
- Work experience with saws and the proper training of sharp tools and implements

Qualifications:

- 1) Have the ability to work effectively with Native American People in a culturally diverse environment.
- 2) Have good time management skills and be able to work under stressful and sometimes hazardous conditions.
- 3) Must have a good attendance record and the ability to stand for 8 hours with saw
- 4) Must abide by PPM and be drug and alcohol free while working.
- 5) Have the ability to establish and maintain good working relationships with the public, fellow colleagues and agencies.
- 6) Have the ability to follow chain of command and follow oral instructions

Requirements:

Must have a National Sawyer Certification card and or provide proof of Sawyer training

Must possess a California driver's license, a good driving record, and be insurable by the PRT insurance carrier.

Adhere to all PRT policies and Safety guidelines and precautions

Must successfully pass a pre-employment drug and alcohol screening and be willing to submit to a background check.

Chain saw and circular sawyers must be at least 18 years of age

Indian Preference: Preference will be given to qualified Native American's under the Federal Indian Preference Act (43 CFR 17.3 (d)). Applicants claiming Indian Preference must submit verification of Indian certification by tribe or affiliation or other acceptable documentation of Indian heritage. Note: This position requires an awareness and deep appreciation of the Pit River Tribe Indian Tradition, customs and socioeconomic need. It requires the ability at all times, to meet and deal effectively in contacts with Indian people and organizations. This requires tact, courtesy, confidentiality, discretion, resourcefulness and good judgment in handling sensitive issues.
